




Celebrating its ninth year, Sunshine Coast Open House has grown to become a hallmark event, honouring our region's rich tapestry of architecture, art, landscape, design, heritage, and community connections

This year's program spanning two months, was our most ambitious yet, with the main event over two weekends in October and delivering an inspiring lineup of experiences that celebrated everything from landscaped gardens, sculpture parks, heritage icons to contemporary sustainable design.

The 2025 program invited participants to explore over 30 architecturally significant homes, civic infrastructure, sustainably designed spaces, gardens, art and heritage buildings across the Sunshine Coast and Noosa region. Visitors enjoyed behind-the-scenes access to spaces that tell the story of our region's past, present, and future.

Night at the Majestic





Ask an Architect at ACE



The website is the primary marketing and information tool and featured events, building details, bookings, volunteer information, photography competition and sponsor details.

Streetscaping update

Stage 1 of the Eumundi streetscape works is set to be completed by April 2025, weather and site conditions permitting. Stage 2 of the works is set to commence in April and continue until August 2025 at Dick Caplick Park. These works will focus on much needed footpaths improvements and landscaping along Memorial Dr.

During the footpath works, businesses will remain accessible for customers and staff during normal trading hours. Temporary signage will help direct motorists and pedestrians, and alternative driveways, pedestrian access points, and loading zones will be provided where necessary. Consideration has been given to the upcoming Easter, ANZAC Day, and Labour Day public holidays and school holiday periods. At times some on-street parking areas will be temporarily unavailable due to safety requirements.

Experience Eumundi and Sunshine Coast Council (SCC) have advised that the free temporary parking at the upper market carpark area off Napier Rd has ceased due to a lack of patronage.




